



he transformation of Hagia Sophia into a mosque seems to have a significant symbolic meaning for Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdogan. It was the largest and most important Greek Orthodox Church before the Ottomans conquered Constantinople in 1453. Hagia Sophia was of similar significance for Greek Orthodox Christians, as St. Peter's Basilica in Rome has been for Catholics. The transformation of the magnificent church into a mosque proved to be a traumatic event for Greek Orthodox Christians, but for the Ottomans, a symbol of victory over Christians. This remained so until 1934, after the Turkish Empire had come to an inglorious end in World War I, and Turkey became a newly formed. secular state under

Ataturk. At that time, the imposing historic building from the Byzantine period was then converted into a museum. Now Erdogan wants to undo that. What does this signify?

Erdogan said on his website: "The resurgence of Hagia Sophia as a mosque is the prelude to the liberation of Al-Aqsa in Jerusalem. It is the footprint of the will of all Muslims worldwide, and the resurgence of the fire of hope of all Muslims and of all humiliated, oppressed, and exploited." This proclamation makes one pause.

In his message, Erdogan talks not only about freedom for the Al-Aqsa Mosque in Jerusalem, but also, depending on which language it is translated into, about a revival of Islam from Bukhara in Uzbekistan to Andalusia in Spain.

The connection of Hagia Sophia to Al-Aqsa in Jerusalem shows that Ankara's ambitions extend far beyond Hagia Sophia.

In Israel, developments in Turkey are being watched with concern. It was hoped that the relationship with Turkey could be rebalanced, as it was once very good. But by now, Israel has realized that this can no longer be accomplished. So far, Israel has avoided confrontation with Turkey, because trade relations are still very important and extensive for both sides.

Israel's gas discoveries in the Mediterranean the Sea, and planned gas pipeline from Mediterranean to Europe, in cooperation with Cyprus and Greece, have been met with resentment by the Turks. Turkey began its own drilling in the disputed waters of the Mediterranean, and wants to expand its dominion in the sea. Turkey's interference in the civil war in Libya is yet another attempt to expand its influence in the Mediterranean.


Israel has always seen Iran as the great threat—and rightly so, because Iran has been talking bluntly about the destruction of the Jewish State for many years but has somewhat ignored developments in Turkey. Although Turkey and Iran have been rather hostile in the past, common purpose and ideology have brought them closer together. This development, of course, must be extremely alarming and worrisome for Israel.

Another cause for concern for Israel is the fact that the United States has so far failed to fully recognize this threat from Turkey. President Trump's policy is to stay out of conflicts that do not directly affect America, and to bring its own troops home. A policy that can be understood, but which would particularly cost Israel very dearly. The following words from the Bible are a strong consolation in this situation: "...He who keeps Israel will neither slumber nor sleep" (Psalm 121:4).

With this confidence, I greet you warmly with Shalom from Israel.

In Revelation 15, John sees a panorama of the final judgment of the end times. Related to this is the restoration and redemption of the people of Israel. An exposition.

"Which stilleth the noise of the seas, the noise of their waves, and the tumult of the people" (Psalm 65:7).

s athletes prepare for the starting gun; as soldiers prepare for the attack; as sailors hoist the sails to cast off; so the seven angels will prepare for the final judgments of God in the end time: "And I saw another sign in heaven, great and marvellous, seven angels having the seven last plagues; for in them is filled up the wrath of God" (Rev 15:1). In conjunction with this, in the Apostle John's vision, "I saw as it were a sea of glass mingled with fire: and them that had gotten the victory over the beast, and over his image, and over his mark, and over the number of his name, stand on the sea of glass, having the harps of God" (Rev 15:2).

The scenery brings to mind several "seas" in the Bible. First, it is suggestive of the large washbasin in front of the temple, which was also called a sea: "And he made a molten sea, ten cubits from the one brim to the other:

it was round all about, and his height was five cubits: and a line of thirty cubits did compass it round about" (1 Kings 7:23). Then, it reminds us of the Red Sea that Israel crossed through to be free. After passing through it, the Israelites sang a song with Moses (cf. Rev 15:3-4). We also know of the "Sea of Nations": "Which stilleth the noise of the seas, the noise of their waves, and the tumult of the people" (Ps 65:7). And furthermore, we know that the anti-Christian world ruler comes from the Sea of Nations (Rev 13:1), in contrast to the Antichrist, who comes from the earth (Eretz Israel: Rev 13:11). [Editor's note: This is Mr. Lieth's personal interpretation, which defers from most who believe the first beast is the Antichrist, and the second the False Prophet.]

Revelation 4:6 references the glass sea: "And before the throne there was a sea of glass like unto crystal: and in the midst of the

throne, and round about the throne, were four beasts full of eyes before and behind." This sea could well mean the Sea of Nations that is before the throne of God, and which is seen from the perspective of the omnipresent One. Everything is in God's presence; everything is in His sight; the whole world is revealed to Him; and He penetrates and sees through everything. The glory of God is enthroned over the whole earth. No being is invisible to Him.

This sea is infused with fire, which indicates the judgment. The redeemed stand by the sea; they are no longer in it. They have been saved by the blood of the Lamb. In the Great Tribulation, they went through the fire of suffering (baptism of fire), and the torrents of the Antichrist's waters washed over them. But, the fire couldn't scorch them, and the water couldn't drown them (Isa 43:2). Now, the overcomers

are no longer at sea, but they are liberated and look back triumphantly from above. "And they sing the song of Moses the servant of God, and the song of the Lamb, saying, Great and marvellous are thy works, Lord God Almighty; just and true are thy ways, thou King of saints. Who shall not fear thee, O Lord, and glorify thy name? for thou only art holy: for all nations shall come and worship before thee; for thy judgments are made manifest" (Rev 15:3-4).

Just as Israel sang a song with Moses after crossing the Red Sea (Ex 15:1), it happens again. The Egyptians were judged in the sea, and Israel was liberated by the blood of the Lamb and by the passage through the sea. It is similar here. The world is judged, but the overcomers are saved by the blood of the Lamb, through the Tribulation.

Revelation is proof that the Jews still have a central role in

God's plan for the salvation of the world. It all comes full circle in Revelation. The first song that we find in the Bible is the song of Moses and the Israelites in Exodus 15. Additionally, we're introduced to another of Moses' songs in Deuteronomy 32, which he performed together with Joshua before the people (31:30; 32:44). And now, the first and last songs of the Bible are mentioned

together in Revelation. This points us to the following: The song of Moses is connected to the song of the Lamb; it retains its meaning. It starts and ends with Israel, and the goal is the Lamb. Through this, God shows us how everything belongs together, and nothing is forsaken. The prophetic calling of Moses was to focus on Jesus. Moses without Jesus is unthinkable.

We see through both songs that the Old and New Testaments form a unified whole. The song of Moses in Deuteronomy 32 gives a complete overview of Israel's history. The preceding verses (Deut 31:29-30) show that it's about the end of days. The song in Deuteronomy 32 is divided into the following sections: verses 1-6 describe God's greatness and faithfulness. Verses 7-14: Israel's early history. Verses 15-19: the time of the prophets. Verses 20-21: God withdraws from His people. Verses 22-33: God scatters His people and abandons them to persecution. Verses 34-36: The end times are approaching, both the day of God's mercy, as well as His vengeance. Verses 37-42: judgment in the time of Revelation. Verse 43: The final blessing and redemption of Israel.

"And after that I looked, and, behold, the temple of the tabernacle of the testimony in heaven was opened: And the seven angels came out of the temple, having the seven plagues, clothed in pure

and white linen, and having their breasts girded with golden girdles. And one of the four beasts gave unto the seven angels seven golden vials full of the wrath of God. who liveth for ever and ever. And the temple was filled with smoke from the glory of God, and from his power; and no man was able to enter into the temple, till the seven plagues of the seven angels were fulfilled" (Rev 15:5-8).

The heavenly temple that is opened is the original, the highest dwelling place of God. The earthly temple and the tabernacle were depictions of it. The angels are dressed in a priestly manner and perform a holy, just, and priestly service. They are in the service of the King. The golden bowls of the seven messengers correspond to the vessels used in the tent to scatter the blood (Ex 27:3). This shows that the courts are all just and belong to the holiness of God.

The cloud of smoke and the fact that no one can enter the temple make us think of Jeremiah's time: "Thou hast covered

thyself with a cloud, that our prayer should not pass through" (Lam 3:44). The time of God's final wrath has come, when He veils Himself in His unapproachable glory and completes the judgment. God withdraws and only reveals Himself through that judgment. Perhaps it is also to be understood as a hint that God has no pleasure in judgment, but that He must do it for His righteousness. It was said before in Lamentations: "For he doth not afflict willingly nor grieve the children of men" (3:33). Yes, He wraps Himself up, isolates, and no one is allowed to come near Him. Doesn't this also remind one of how people act when they are grieving?

The realization that the people of Israel will come to in the last days, according to Revelation 15 and Deuteronomy 32, is remarkable. What a wonderful confession of God and the Lamb, which they've been led to through the Tribulation! For millennia the Jewish people resisted it, refused to admit it, denied it, mocked it, portrayed Jesus as Beelzebub, cursed and persecuted Him and His followers, ignored Isaiah 53 in their Scripture readings...and now this confession to the Lamb.

This is reminiscent of people who didn't want to know anything about Jesus for a long time, and later praise Him for everything. It can happen again and again that people who were previously opposed to Christ convert and become His confessors.

Jerusalem at the Time of Destruction

In the 1970s, prominent archaeologist Nahman Avigad, who was conducting excavations in the Old City of Jerusalem, came across a small complex in the Jewish Quarter.

The structure, which became renowned as "the Burnt House," turned out to be one of the most meaningful testimonies of how the city lived, and fell, in the first century—the house of a priestly family razed when the Romans captured Jerusalem and destroyed the Temple in 70 CE.

However, the tradition had started centuries earlier, after the first Jewish Temple was destroyed by the Babylonians in 586 BCE.

Half a century after the discovery of the Burnt House, today a popular museum, a lot more is known about what Jerusalem looked like and how its people lived on the eves of those days of destruction.



'WE HAVE A VACCINE'

"We have extensive knowledge about both moments because destructions have the ability to freeze the instant in time," Tel Aviv University Prof. Yuval Gadot told *The Jerusalem Post.* He is the co-director of the Givati Parking Lot Excavation of the City of David by the Temple Mount.

"From the archaeological perspective, a destruction leaves remains that are much clearer than those that are the result of a process where a site is gradually abandoned or reused," he said. "The more radical the devastation is, the more numerous and revealing are the traces it leaves behind."

"This is one of the reasons we know less about the Babylonian conquest compared with the Roman one: It appears that the Babylonians did not destroy everything at the same level and with the same intensity than the Romans did."

"Even though we do not have any archaeological evidence for the First Temple, we know that the Temple Mount was the city's focal point, and we believe that the palace of the king was also very close to it," he said. "Over the decades, archaeologists have uncovered remains of imposing public buildings, a sophisticated bureaucracy and writing system, a rich material culture."

"Recently, archaeologists even discovered a fountain with running water in the Western Wall tunnel," said Dr. Guy D. Stiebel,


senior lecturer at TAU. "The city was larger than the Old City today. The palace of the king stood not far from the area of Jaffa Gate, surrounded by gardens. We know that the priests and the ruling class lived in large houses and were heavily influenced by the Roman customs."

As the archaeologists pointed out, the traces of Jerusalem's past are all over the city. And 2,000 years later, Jerusalem has not ceased to represent a symbol and an attraction to people and visitors from all over the world.

Commentary: The prophecy of the destruction of the temple is found in Matthew 24:1-2: "And Jesus went out, and departed from the temple: and his disciples came to him for to show him the buildings of the temple. And Jesus said unto them, See ye not all these things? verily I say unto you, There shall not be left here one stone upon another, that shall not be thrown down." That was fulfilled in the year 70 AD, when Roman forces conquered Jerusalem and destroyed the second temple.

Will there be a third temple? Jesus makes vague reference to it in Mark 13:14: "But when ye shall see the abomination of desolation, spoken of by Daniel the prophet, standing where it ought not, (let him that readeth understand,) then let them that be in Judaea flee to the mountains." We note the words, "standing where it ought not." This could indicate that a third temple will be built within or without the temple compound, which many



believe will take place during the reign of Antichrist.

Kingdom of Judah Government Compound Found

Uncovered only three kilometers (1.8 mile) outside the Old City, the compound is believed by Israel Antiquities Authority archaeologists to have served as an administrative center during the reigns of Judean kings Hezekiah and Menashe (8th century to the middle of the 7th century BCE).

Over 120 jar handles stamped 2,700 years ago with ancient Hebrew script seal impressions were dis-

covered at the site, clearly indicating the location's use as a storage and tax center, according to an IAA press release. Prevalent among the stamped inscriptions is "LMLK," "LamMeLeKh," or "Belonging to the King," a way of marking that the foodstuffs stored in the jars had been tithed to the Judean ruler.

"This is one of the most significant discoveries from the period of the Kings in Jerusalem made in recent years. At the site we excavated, there are signs that governmental activity managed and distributed food supplies not only for shortage but administered agricultural surplus amassing commodities and wealth," said IAA excavation co-directors Sapir and Nathan Ben-Ari in a press release.

"The archaeological discoveries at Arnona identify the site as a key site—the most important in the history of the final days of the Kingdom of Judah and of the return to Zion decades after the destruction of the Kingdom. This site joins a number of other key sites uncovered in the area of Jerusalem which were connected to the centralized administrative system of the Kingdom of Judah from its peak until its destruction," said Dr. Yuval Baruch, the IAA's Jerusalem District Archaeologist.

Usually the ancient Hebrew LMLK inscription appears above the sun disc;

in the case of the Arnona impressions and also some of those found at excavations elsewhere, below the sun disc is recorded one of four cities in the kingdom of Judah: Hebron, Ziph, Socho or Mmst.

According to the archaeologists, the Arnona site is dated to a period in which the Bible documents tumultuous upheavals, including the failed Assyrian King Sennacherib campaign to

IDF RESPONDS TO GAZA ATTACK

DF fighter jets and aircraft evening attacked an underground infrastructure belonging to Hamas in the northern Gaza Strip, in response to the firing of incendiary balloons from Gaza towards Israeli territory.

During the day, three fires broke out in open areas in the Eshkol and Ashkelon regional councils due to incendiary balloons fired by Arabs from the Gaza Strip.

One of the incendiary balloons was located in the industrial area of Arad. A police sapper discovered an explosive device with a delay mechanism and neutralized it.

conquer Jerusalem in the days of King Hezekiah. The artifacts at the site, including the stamped seals, show that taxation likely remained uninterrupted during this period.

With the destruction of the Kingdom of Judah in 586 BCE and Babylonian exile, the site was abandoned, said the researchers. However, shortly thereafter, "the site was resettled and administrative activity resumed. During this time governmental activity at the site was connected to the Judean province upon the Return to Zion in 538 BCE under the auspices of the Achaemenid Persian Empire, which then ruled over the entire ancient Near East and Central Asia."

"These artificial stone hills have been identified at several sites in Jerusalem and are a phenomenon of the end of the First Temple period and have aroused the curiosity and fascination of Jerusalem researchers since the beginning of archaeological research in the area," said the archaeologists.

"Nevertheless, the reason for the huge effort made in stacking them over many acres remains an unresolved archaeological mystery," they said.



Commentary: It is virtually impossible to start a building project in Israel without uncovering history.

License Denied for Evangelical TV Channel

The HOT cable TV provider has declined to request a new license for the Shelanu TV Evangelical channel, after the Council for Cable and Satellite Broadcasting suspended its original license.



Shelanu TV, which critics accused of seeking to proselytize Jews, is now left without a cable TV provider in the near future, but says it will move to an internet platform, insisting it will "not be silenced."

In a statement to the press, Ron Cantor, a spokesman for Shelanu TV and a prominent figure among so-called Messianic Jews in Israel, again denied the allegations made by council chairman Asher Biton that Shelanu TV's original license request had sought to cover up its intention of appealing to Jewish Israelis

Shelanu TV's license was granted in April, and the commencement of its broadcasts sparked criticism when it became clear that its parent organization, GOD TV, is dedicated to preaching the Christian gospel and the task of the "Great Commission," a doctrine in Christian theology to gain disciples for Christianity and to preach the religion to non-Christians.

In a video announcing the new channel, GOD TV CEO Ward Simpson stated, "God has supernaturally opened the door for us

people."

He then retracted the video and issued a new statement saying Shelanu TV was not trying to convert Jews, and told *The Jerusalem Post* his channel was "calling on the Jewish community to reexamine the claim that Yeshua is the Messiah."

Commentary: There is no law against Hinduism, Buddhism, Islam, or atheism. But strangely, when it comes to Christianity, Jews in Israel are frightened. Erdogan Vows to Liberate Al-Aqsa

Turkey's President Recep Tayyip Erdogan vowed to "liberate al-Aqsa mosque" from Israel after "resurrecting Hagia Sophia" as a mosque.

The decision to change the status of the ancient Hagia Sophia church, which had been transformed into a mosque in 1453 and then into a museum in 1934, was made controversially.

The speech, which was in Turkish, was translated slightly differently to Arabic and English, apparently as a way to hide part of Ankara's full views on how it has linked Hagia Sophia to a wider agenda.

In Arabic the speech says that turning Hagia Sophia into a mosque is part of the "return of freedom to al-Aqsa," essentially meaning Israel should be ejected from controlling Jerusalem's Old City where al-Aqsa is located.

Turkey is seeking to supplant Saudi Arabia and other countries in the region, such as Egypt and Jordan, as the main determiner of what is "Islamic."

One day, Turkey could even aim its sights at Jerusalem. The speech about Hagia Sophia clearly indicated this is on the agenda in the future.

World's First 3D-Printed Steak

Israeli foodies will be able to take a bite out of the world's first 3D-printed plant-based steak later this year thanks to a breakthrough in food technology.

Redefine Meat, an Israeli company based in Rehovot, has unveiled the "Alt-Steak," which it says replicates the texture, flavor and appearance of real meat via the use of a patent-pending 3D printing technology.

Creating a realistic meatless steak is widely considered to be the holy grail of the alternative meat industry—one that has long eluded food scientists. Plant-based ground meat

varieties have been available on the market for several years but mimicking an actual cut of meat—with its distinctive combination of fat, muscle, sinew and mouth-feel—has proved to be a much greater challenge.

Working together with leading chefs, food technologists and hutchers Redefine Meat digitally mapped over 70 sensorial parameters to craft its meatless wonder It then used a proprietary industrial-scale 3D food printer and multiple materials to print the steak, layer by layer. The steak itself is made out of a combination of soy and pea proteins, coconut fat and sunflower oil, along with natural colors and flavors.

"[It will be] in supermarkets in 2022 but already in restaurants in Israel this year, and in restaurants in Europe early next year," revealed Eshchar Ben-Shitrit, CEO and cofounder of Redefine Meat, adding that initially, the Alt-Steak will be roughly the same price as traditional meat equivalents.

Redefine Meat is not the only company hoping to revolutionize the food industry using groundbreaking advances in 3D printing.

As plant-based steaks prepare to hit restaurants later this year, other Israeli companies are hoping to print steaks made out of real meat that is also slaughter-free.

Cultured meat, more commonly known as lab-grown meat, could soon become as everyday as going to the super-

market. And Israel is at the forefront of technological innovation in this field.

"In terms of cell-based printed meat, yes, Israel absolutely is the leader," Olivia Fox Cabane, an alternative protein expert who is also the co-founder of KindEarth.Tech. told The Media Line.



28 New Hezbollah Missile Launch Sites

There are at least 28 missile launching sites belonging to Hezbollah in civilian areas in the Lebanese capital of Beirut, a report by ALMA Research and Education Center has found.



"Almost all of the sites are in southern Beirut, an area controlled by Hezbollah, and are located in civilian neighborhoods, inside private houses, medical centers, churches, industrial sites, public offices, fast food chains, as well as in open spaces nearby, hence activating the 'human shield' tactic," the report read.

And according to the report, "Based on our insight into Hezbollah's action patterns these sites are available for immediate operational use."

The group has expanded its arsenal with more than 130,000

virtual prayer session that included several Dallas-area synagogues was "Zoom bombed" by intruders shouting hate messages.

The incident took place on July 30, the Jewish fast day of Tisha B'Av.

The intruders, faces covered, shouted and typed comments such as "Kill All Jews. Bomb Israel" and "Hail (sic) Hitler," Rabbi Ariel Rackovsky of Congregation Shaare Tefilla told the Dallas News. One continued to make the Nazi salute.

Some 100 people. ranging in age from preteens to 80 years old, were on the Zoom call at the time. After about five minutes the rabbis terminated the call and started a new one. One of the rabbis called the FBI. according to the report.

Hezbollah is a Shiite Muslim, militant group in Lebanon, with a security system, political organization, and social services. It is considered "a state within a state." Hezbollah has supported the Syrian government and has gained decades of experience in warfare. The Hezbollah organization was founded in the early 1980s, as

part of an Iranian effort to secure Syria and Lebanon for its purposes. Hezbollah is designated as a terrorist entity by France, Spain, Germany, the USA, and other nations.

It is of interest that the missile launch sites are primarily located in civilian areas: medical centers, even churches and public offices. Hamas operates in Gaza on similar principles. But Israel knows the locations and will act accordingly when necessary. That's one of Israel's great advantages: being able to communicate in many different languages around the world. They know the plans of their enemies.

This is a great lesson for us Christians. We may read, hear, and see reports by various news media outlets, but when reading the prophetic Word, we know the purpose and the target of these things. Therefore, we too must be alert 24/7 for attacks of the enemy in the invisible world. But, the good news is that we believe in Jesus Christ and trust in Him, of whom Colossians 2:15 states: "And having spoiled principalities and powers, he made a show of them openly, triumphing over them in it."

Reservists Drafted to Help Fight Coronavirus

Israel's parliament gave the government sweeping authorities to combat a resurgent coronavirus outbreak, weakening its own oversight over cabinet decisions as Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu warns of a possible second lockdown.



Israel plans to draft as many as 3,000 reservists to help rein in the coronavirus outbreak, the Defense Ministry said.

The reservists, most from the Home Front Command, will assist with epidemiological investigations and provide extra staffing for quarantine hotels, the ministry said. They'll also boost the command's presence in cities with a relatively large number of infections.

There are more than 72,000 confirmed coronavirus cases in Israel to date, including more than 530 fatalities. The plan to involve the military more was pushed by Israel's new coronavirus czar, who was appointed to try to formulate a coherent strategy to combat the surge in cases and deaths that followed Israel's reopening of its economy after a near-total lockdown.

Then reading the historic document of the Jews' return to the Promised Land, we must note the words in chapter 1, verse 1, "the Lord stirred up the spirit of Cyrus king of Persia." "By stating that Zionists are not welcome to its store, this business is basically stating that Jewish people are not welcome," Rabbi Meyer May, the center's executive director, said in a statement. "This is clear anti-Semitism, extremely discriminatory and unacceptable."

Taking legal action, the International Legal Forum (ILF) has filed a complaint with the Human Rights Tribunal of Ontario, charging that based on the guidelines of the International Holocaust Remembrance Alliance's (IHRA) working definition of anti-Semitism, Kimberly Hawkins, the owner, should be charged with anti-Semitic discrimination.

"IHRA acknowledges and incorporates the connection between Jews and Jewish national identity, and its fulfillment in the Jewish nation state, as a central expression of Jewish identity, similar to observance of Jewish holidays and religious practices such as dietary laws, Sabbath and other," the ILF stated.

Euphemistic manifestations of hatred, such as calls against Zionists instead of Jews, enable the rise in hateful expressions towards Jews and the increase in anti-Semitism, while supposedly evading violating modern norms against discrimination, violence or incitement on racial or religious grounds. IHRA bridges this gap, and links anti-Zionism to anti-Semitism, the lawfare organization explained.
